
Step-by-step guide to creating a UKVI account and registering for an e-Visa

Step 1

Currently you must have been sent an invitation from UKVI to be able to start the e-Visa process. The UKVI will be contacting a select group of visa holders in Spring/Summer 2024.

From late Summer 2024, UKVI have said they will open the e-Visa registration process up to all eligible visa holders, at which point an invitation will no longer be required.

Don't worry if you don't receive an email from UKVI, you will still be able to create a UKVI Account and register for an e-Visa later on this year.



What do I need to do now?

To create a UKVI account and access your eVisa you will need:

- · Your date of birth
- · Your BRP Number
- Your passport (if you do not have a BRP)
- · Access to an email address and phone number
- · Access to a smartphone

You can create an account using the following link: https://www.gov.uk/get-access-evisa. You should not share this link with anyone else as it may not work for them.

Click on the link embedded within the email and follow the instructions on-screen.

Get access to your eVisa

An eVisa is an online record of your immigration status.

To get access to your eVisa, you'll need to create a UK Visas and Immigration (UKVI) account.

Who can use this service

You can use this service if the Home Office has emailed you about how to get access to your eVisa.

If you've not been contacted by the Home Office, you do not need to do anything yet. You'll be able to set up access to your eVisa later in 2024.

There is more information about when eVisas are being introduced and what they're replacing.

What you need to do

You will be asked to:

- · create a UKVI account
- confirm your identity using the 'UK Immigration ID Check' app

This information will be used to link your eVisa to your UKVI account. You'll get an email when you can access your eVisa in your account.

Before you start

You will need:

- an email address and phone number
- access to a smartphone
- your BRP card (or a valid passport, and either your BRP number or your visa application number)



Click 'start now'. We recommend using your own personal email and phone numbers. Avoid using contact details belonging to someone else as this may cause complications for you being able to access your UKVI Account and proving your immigration status in the future.

We advise you **not** to use your Swansea University email address as this account will close when you leave the University.

If you have **indefinite leave to remain (ILR)** but your BRP has already expired, select the appropriate answer and confirm whether you have a valid passport. You should still be directed to create a UKVI Account.

Create a UK Visas and Immigration (UKVI) account

You need to create a UKVI account to:

- view your immigration status (eVisa) online
- access someone's account so you can help them get an eVisa
- act on behalf of someone who cannot manage their account. For example, a young child or vulnerable person
- confirm your identity, update your details or get proof of your immigration status

You will need the following details either for yourself or someone you're acting on behalf of:

- date of birth
- a biometric residence permit (BRP), passport or other identity document
- access to your email address or phone number

If you want to give someone access to your account, you will need their email and phone number.



Check your answers before you create your account

Stop and check the answers you have entered so far – it is much easier to correct any mistakes at this point, than having to correct them later on.



Once you have completed the final steps, you will receive an email confirming the UKVI Account has been set-up. File this email somewhere safe and follow any instructions in the email.

Your UKVI Account should now be ready to access.

If you completed **Step 1** on your laptop, now is the time to switch to your smartphone or tablet because you will need to download and use the UK Immigration: ID Check App for the next part of the process.


Check your emails for a link in order to sign back in. Sign into your UKVI Account using your smartphone and follow the instructions on-screen.

Sign back into your UKVI Account and continue with **Step 2** – which is to confirm your identity.



If you used your BRP card to create your UKVI Account, you will need to re-enter the details and use your phone/email address to receive one-time access codes in order to sign back in.

Once signed in, you will be prompted to download the **UK Immigration: ID Check** App



Download the App to your device. You need to link the App to your UKVI Account either using the QR code on-screen or request a connection code. If the QR code doesn't work, try generating a connection code instead.



Make sure you are using the **correct** App, check the name of the App (**UK Immigration: ID Check** App) and that the author of the App is **'UK Visa and Immigration'**


Follow the instructions step-by-step as they appear on-screen. Using the UK Immigration: ID Check App, you will be directed take a photo of your BRP (front and back), scan the biometric chip inside the card, take a biometric scan of your face and finally take a photo that will appear on your e-Visa.

When taking your photo, we recommend you find a well-lit, plain wall background. The photo image must be clear with nothing covering your face and without any shadows. You can do this yourself by taking a selfie or you can ask a friend to take the photo for you.

This photo will appear on your e-Visa so make sure you are happy with it.

Step 3

Next you will link your e-Visa to your UKVI Account.




On screen you will see a list of sections. You have just completed the 'confirm your identity' section. Next you will need to complete the 'contact preferences' section. You need to complete each section in the order they appear on screen – you cannot jump ahead.

Contact details must be ones that the UKVI can contact you on.

Account security questions are questions and answers that are selected by you and will be used to help verify your identity over the phone if you ever need to contact the UKVI call centre about any problem with your account.

Choose one question and answer from each set (there are three sets) and make a note of these somewhere safe where you can access them in the future if needed. Save and move on to the next section.

Read and sign the digital declaration page and then press Submit.



Confirmation that you have submitted your e-Visa registration will appear on screen and you will also receive an email.

It can take a few days for your e-Visa to be ready to view on your UKVI Account, so **do not** worry if you don't receive your e-Visa immediately. Keep checking your inbox including your

junk and spam folders. Once your e-Visa is ready to view, you will receive another email from UKVI with instructions on how to view and prove your immigration status using your e-Visa. File this email somewhere safe.

Once received, sign in and view your e-Visa as soon as possible and check all of the details are correct.

You will see your photograph as well as similar information to what you currently see on your BRP – name, date of birth, visa type e.g. Student, Graduate, visa start and expiry dates as well as a list of all the things you can and cannot do with your type of visa - these are known as your visa 'conditions'.

Try and complete Steps 1-3 in one go if possible, it should take around 15-20 minutes to complete.

If you have **Dependants** with you in the UK, each Dependant will need their own UKVI Account and e-Visa so please repeat the steps 1 – 3 above for each family member.

Finally, Step 4

Your e-Visa is linked to the travel ID document used to create your UKVI Account. For most people this will be the BRP. You must continue to carry your BRP when you travel in and out of the UK for as long as it remains valid.

When you arrive in the UK at the airport, ferry or railway terminal you will have your ID document scanned at the immigration desk. The e-Visa needs to be linked to that travel ID document for the immigration officer to be able to see your immigration status.

Before your BRP expires you **MUST** <u>update your UKVI Account</u> with your **current passport details** and link your e-Visa to it because **this** will be the travel document you will use for international travel once your BRP expires on 31st December 2024.

Failing to keep your UKVI Account updated will result in delays at the UK border and difficulty proving your immigration status.
